Progress since June 2008		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> "Walking 2 Health" schemes are now well developed and active across all districts with 100's of local residents participating in walks on a weekly basis, and a significant amount of volunteering time going in to helping them function. Fareham shows 117 hours of contribution and Havant have recorded 20 hours per week of volunteer time going into their scheme. The voluntary sector in Havant and Gosport has been commissioned to delivery Health Trainer Programmes in these areas of highest health and social inequalities. Trainers have been recruited and trained, with delivery to start end September/ mid-October. Fareham's – Healthwise: Streetwise annual programme for Year 6 children has been successfully delivered. Healthy Schools status in all districts has progressed with achievements of 10% increase from Gosport and Havant schools, where progress has been slower in the past, and 2% increase from Fareham schools where Healthy Schools engagement has a longer history. Fareham Exercise Referral scheme is a success story of 154 referrals from local GPs to date, with 22 of these participants taking up full leisure membership at Fareham Leisure Centre. Weight Management Programmes commissioned by the PCT in the Gosport (1096 referrals target) and Havant (1354 referrals target) areas for patients with a Body Mass Index (BMI) over 30 are set to start service delivery August 08. Fareham are developing new physical activity participation through encouraging a range of groups "into" and "back to sport" – Women's Football, Running Workshops and Table Tennis all feature in this programme. The national Child Annual Measurement programme 2008 has completed for Year R and Year 6 children. Department of Health (DoH) analysis of this data will be reported November 08. All South East schools with 10% or more Free School Meals Eligibility (FSME) have been invited to join the Cook'n'Eat programme. 11 schools have engaged so far for this initiative, which involves children, parents and teachers after school. Quit4Life stop smoking services continue to be well supported across all areas, with the South East contributing the largest part of the Local Area Agreement (LAA) smoking target. The Q1 		

08/09 target for Hampshire has been met in full.

- Hampshire Fire & Rescue Service (HFRS) is working in partnership with Quit4Life to raise awareness of the link between smoking and home fire safety.
- Alcohol interventions via a range of settings and providers are being commissioned by the PCT and these plans are being rolled out over the autumn/ winter period. Training of practitioners to underpin this plan starts September 08.
- Cardio-vascular disease “case-finding” software is going live in 13 out of 31 GP practices in South East Hampshire. This will help identify those patients who can benefit from vascular interventions such as smoking cessation, weight management, and exercise of other lifestyle improvements/ modifications.
- HomeCheck Schemes in Gosport and Fareham recorded constant usage with many of these checks being done in homes where children 0-5 years reside, with the aim of reducing child accidents in the home.
- Fareham has initiated “seated exercise to music training” as part of a falls prevention approach. 9 instructors being available for the delivery of weekly sessions across the borough from Jan. 09.
- Following the public health workforce development project in district local authorities and the report of its findings, a proposal is being drafted on how a programme of public health engagement and training for local authority front-line workers can be structured and facilitated over 08/09, to improved population health improvement and public health partnership working between the PCT and local authorities in the South East.
