<p>The FETP has met once since the last Board meeting.</p> <p>Priority 1 – Lead still to be appointed. Working in partnership with the Gosport Transport and Sustainability Partnership on a 'reduce congestion' campaign which will encompass banners on the A32 with key messages encouraging motorists to travel more sustainably (e.g. car sharing, public transport). A bid for funding to support this has been submitted to the LAA as it ties in directly to the local hotspot congestion priority and the 'reduce' travel agenda. Will work in partnership with local schools to design banners.</p> <p>Priority 2 – Colin Mitchell appointed as lead. Fareham Climate Change strategy will be ready for review by the FETP Jan 2010. Inviting founder of the 'Greening' campaign to November meeting to try and find out how the FETP can support motivated individuals within the community to form their own greening campaigns to inspire people to reduce their energy consumption and therefore lower their personal and community carbon footprint.</p> <p>Priority 3 – Pauline Holmes appointed as lead.
