Progress since June 2009		

Key headlines since March 2009:

- Fareham Walking to Health Initiative has seen XX participants take part in XX walk so far this year
- Volunteer walk leaders training took place in June 2009. With 12 volunteers trained to lead community walks and walks from Children's Centres.
- The Public Health Workforce workshop was delivered to members and officers on 1st July and the feedback report from the facilitators has been circulated back to Councils. How this should be built on to gain more local health impact will be an agenda item at the next SEPHLB Executive and Officers Group in September.
- Fareham Exercise Referral Scheme have received 171 referral between the period January - July 2009 with 22 of those taking up membership with Fareham Leisure Centre
- The working group established between community development officers from Fareham, Havant and Gosport are working towards a Mature Movers projects for older people. An instructors training programme will commence in January 2010 if funding is secured from SPAA.
- 1400 participants have attended Fareham seated exercise 'Chairobics' sessions to date.
- Latest analysis of Hampshire stop smoking service (Quit4life) 08/09 shows that 565 people (16+) stopped smoking in Fareham, with an average success rate of 47.6%. This delivery equates to achieving 6.2 smoking quitters per 1,000 smokers based on a Fareham prevalence rate of 16.9%. At present Fareham has 7% of the total Hampshire stop smoking resource active in the borough (a collective of GP practices, pharmacies and specialist advisers providing services). These performance and capacity characteristics demonstrate symmetry between local need and delivery and indicate that Fareham's smoking rates will track the 1% year-on-year reduction showing nationally in similar boroughs.
- The Smokefree Lives project attended the South Hants Glass under-18's Final at Fareham's Camms Hall where 300 spectators watched the game. 5 female referrals to Quit4life were

achieved.

- The SE Hampshire Alcohol Brief Intervention Service is now receiving offender referrals from Fareham Police Station under a Conditional Cautioning Protocol; 5 offenders in May, 5 in June and 8 during July.
- The National Healthy Schools scheme is in a process of transformation to Spring 2010. This will enable time for training and familiarisation with teachers and other school support staff to enable the implementation of the Government's "Schools Well Being Indicators" alongside enhancements in PHSE and citizenship components.
